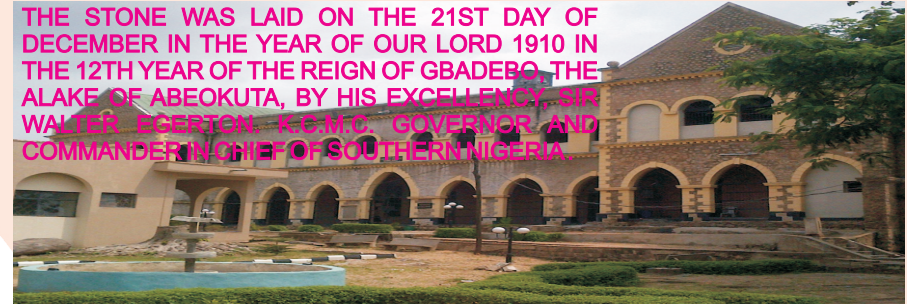

### **Diligent Focus on Vision and Goals: Pathways to Great Achievements**

Over the past five months since resuming duty as Rector of the Crowther Graduate Theological Seminary (CGTS), Abeokuta, Ven. Prof. Rotimi Williams Omotoye has approached his responsibilities with unwavering determination and a strong sense of purpose. His leadership has been marked by assiduousness, strategic focus, and fortitude – qualities that aptly define his administrative disposition.

Since assuming office, the Rector has demonstrated an exceptional commitment to duty, characterized by diligence, clarity of vision, and a resolute drive toward institutional excellence. His administration is guided by clearly articulated goals and a deliberate emphasis on measurable outcomes that align with and advance the Seminary's mission and long-term strategic objectives.

Within this relatively brief period, his leadership has already yielded significant progress across academic, administrative, and institutional development spheres. Several strategic initiatives have been successfully launched, while others remain actively underway, reflecting a dynamic, responsive, and forward-looking administration.

### **1. Registration of CGTS with ACTEA and WAATI (In Progress)**

The registration of Crowther Graduate Theological Seminary (CGTS) with two major theological accreditation bodies in Africa – the **Association for Christian Theological Education in Africa (ACTEA)** and the **West African Association for Theological Institutions (WAATI)**, is currently in progress. This process involves official visitation exercises by each body to assess the Seminary's academic facilities and institutional capacity. Areas of assessment include the library, Information and Communication Technology (ICT) facilities, academic and non-academic staff strength, and other relevant infrastructural and administrative structures.

CGTS anticipates the accreditation visitation of WAATI in **February 2026**, while that ACTEA is projected for **March 2026**.

In preparation for these visits, extensive restructuring and renovation activities have been initiated across the Seminary. These include the upgrading of the library, hostels, vehicles, solar power installations, and the reorganization of academic and non-academic staff structures. These activities commenced in late **2025** and remain on-going.

### **2. Upgrading of the CGTS Library**

The library, being a core academic facility, is a critical requirement for ACTEA and WAATI accreditation.

In line with standardization expectations, the official location of the CGTS Library has been relocated from the upper floor to the ground floor to improve accessibility and functionality.

Following the renovation of the new space, the relocation of shelves and books is being carried out in phases. Ongoing activities include the sorting, cataloguing, and systematic arrangement of books and journals. Members of the Library Relocation Committee have been mandated to ensure that the library meets accreditation standards in readiness for ACTEA and WAATI inspections.

To further strengthen the library's holdings, additional current scholarly books and academic journals in theology, philosophy, and related disciplines are required. Consequently, the Rector appeals to CGTS alumni, students, staff, and other stakeholders to donate relevant books and journals.

The Rector expresses appreciation to **Rev. Dr. Olusola-Niyi**, Secretary of the Alumni Association, who visited CGTS on **6 January 2026** and donated three academic books to the library. He encourages other alumni officials and members to emulate this commendable gesture.

For some time, CGTS has operated without a professionally trained librarian, relying instead on library coordinators. As part of the library standardization process, the Rector proposed the appointment of a qualified librarian. This proposal was presented at the **CGTS Governing Council meeting held on 22 January 2026**, where it received collective approval. The Council directed that the position be formally advertised, with implementation to follow in due course.

### 3. CGTS Governing Council Meeting (22 January 2026)

The Governing Council of Crowther Graduate Theological Seminary, Abeokuta, held its first meeting for the year on **Thursday, 22 January 2026**.

The meeting was conducted in a hybrid format, combining physical and virtual participation.

Physical participants arrived at the CGTS premises on **Wednesday, 21 January 2026**, and conducted a tour of the Seminary's facilities. The tour aimed at assessing infrastructural development and aligning ongoing upgrades with accreditation standards required by ACTEA and WAATI.

Facilities visited included: the new library location, CGTS Senate Building construction site, business and faculty areas, ICT Centre, car park, PEJAK Guest House, and the CGTS house at Oke-Ata. Following these inspections, the Council reached key resolutions on infrastructural upgrades and resource optimization.

#### KEY COUNCIL DECISIONS

##### Refurbishment of Vehicles:

The Council directed that long-abandoned vehicles at the motor pool be

refurbished and returned to service, given the high cost of acquiring new vehicles. The refurbishment will commence with the 32-seater Coastal Bus, followed by other vehicles as funds permit.

##### CGTS House at Oke-Ata:

The CGTS house at Oke-Ata, donated by the former Primate, The Most Revd. Dr. Peter Jasper Akinola, CON; the main building is currently unoccupied. The Council resolved that the building be renovated and converted into a guest house for prominent CGTS visitors.

In addition to infrastructural matters, the Council deliberated extensively on strategies for academic excellence and staff welfare.

##### 4. Renovation of the PEJAK Event Hall

The PEJAK Event Hall, located at Olomore – approximately ten minutes' drive from CGTS, has recently undergone renovation. The initial phase of the renovation was undertaken by members of the Redeemed Christian Church of God, who use the hall for worship and programmes. This phase involved painting the interior and exterior of the hall.

Subsequently, the CGTS administration carried out additional repairs, including the lighting system and toilet facilities. Upon resumption of duty in January 2026, the Rector visited the facility alongside the Bursar, Works Coordinator, PEJAK Coordinator, Secretary, and two technical officers to assess completed work and identify outstanding needs.

The PEJAK Event Hall is now in good condition and available for rent for religious and socio-economic events. Interested users are advised to contact the PEJAK Coordinator for bookings.

It is noteworthy that the entire PEJAK Guest House has been earmarked for comprehensive reconstruction by the Office of the Primate, Church of Nigeria. The contract has been awarded and awaits commencement. This development is expected to transform the facility into a modern guest house for public use.

##### 5. Free Medical Tests for Staff and Students

In line with his commitment to staff and student welfare, the Rector approved free medical tests for CGTS students and staff, as well as staff of Crowther Academy and Crowther Comprehensive School. The medical

exercise was conducted at the clinic from **Wednesday, 14 January to Friday, 16 January 2026**, according to the following schedule:

- Students – Wednesday, 14 January 2026 (10:00 a.m.)
- Academic Staff – Thursday, 15 January 2026 (10:00 a.m.)
- Non-Academic Staff – Friday, 16 January 2026 (10:00 a.m.)
- Crowther Group of Schools Teachers – Friday, 23 January 2026 (10:00 a.m.)

## **6. Repair of Abandoned CGTS Electrical Appliances**

Many CGTS-owned electrical appliances – including refrigerators, air conditioners, fans, and generators have remained unused due to prolonged disrepair. The Rector initiated a phased repair programme, beginning with refrigerators.

These refrigerators, located across staff offices, administrative units, student hostels, and residential apartments, were inspected by an experienced refrigeration technician to determine which units were repairable. The first phase of repairs commenced at **Shepherd Inn**, where the assigned technician successfully completed the task.

Subsequent phases involving additional refrigerators and other electrical appliances will continue as funds become available.

## **7. 50th Anniversary of the Diocese of Egba: Book Launch and International Conference**

The Diocese of Egba (Anglican Communion) will celebrate its **50th Anniversary in July 2026**. As part of the commemorative activities, the Rector of CGTS has initiated plans for an **International Conference and Book Launch** to be hosted at CGTS.

- **Book Title:** *Historical Development of Christianity in Egba: An Exploration of Political and Socioeconomic Issues (1843–2023)*
- **Conference Theme:** *Scholarly Collaboration and Viable Partnership in the Accomplishment of the Great Commission: Bridging Academia and Field Practice in Missiology*

The event will take place from **14–16 July 2026**. **Professor Olutayo Adesina**, Professor of History at the University of Ibadan and an internationally acclaimed scholar currently based in the UK, has accepted to

deliver the lead paper. The book is published in honour of **Baba Primate, Jasper Akinola (Retired)**.

Academic staff and students of CGTS, as well as scholars from other institutions, are invited to submit abstracts and full papers.

All CGTS academic staff are expected to contribute a chapter to the book project and present papers at the conference. Conference proceedings will be published as journal articles, forming an annual CGTS publication.

## **8. Establishment of a Functional Affiliation Centre at CGTS**

In recognition of the strategic importance of institutional partnerships, the Rector has proposed the establishment of a fully functional **Affiliation Centre** within CGTS. Although initially projected to commence in January 2026, implementation is still in progress.

The Centre will coordinate, document, and manage all matters relating to CGTS-affiliated institutions and related academic collaborations. A Secretary will be appointed to oversee daily operations and report directly to the Rector, ensuring efficiency and accountability

## **Recent Past Events at CGTS**

### **First Semester Resumption**

Students and staff of Crowther Graduate Theological Seminary (CGTS) resumed for the **2026/2027 academic session on Monday, 5 January 2026**. Staff resumption was marked by the regular Monday morning devotion held at **10:00 a.m.**, which, on this occasion, was characterized by visible joy and renewed enthusiasm following the Christmas and New Year holidays.

During the devotion, the Rector expressed appreciation to members of staff for their commitment, cooperation, and dedication since his assumption of office. He also used the opportunity to brief staff on key institutional developments and expectations for the new semester.

The major points highlighted included:

- Extension of the tenure of the Chaplain, **Revd. Canon Oluwawole**, for an additional two years.
- An appeal to both academic and non-academic staff to attend official chapel programmes regularly and punctually.
- A directive that occupancy of administrative offices shall be for a maximum tenure of **two years**.
- Publication of academic papers shall constitute **40%** of the criteria for promotion of academic staff.
- Other promotion criteria shall account for **60%**, including availability, dedication, teaching load, conference participation, and contributions to CGTS activities.

The Rector encouraged all staff to remain diligent and committed in their respective vocations, emphasizing that resumption signified the immediate commencement of official duties.

Academic programme coordinators were directed to contact students regarding resumption, registration, the welcome service, and the commencement of first-semester lectures on **12 January 2026**.

The staff devotion concluded with a heartfelt prayer of thanksgiving and commitment led by **The Rt. Revd. Dr. Rufus Adepoju**.

### **Resumption Welcome Service for Staff and Students**

The resumption of staff and students for the first semester of the 2026/2027 academic year was formally marked with a **Welcome Service** held on **Thursday, 8 January 2026**, at **12:00 noon** in the **Chapel of Christ Our Wisdom**.

The Holy Communion service was officiated by Anglican priests and well attended by CGTS staff, students, staff of Crowther Academy Schools, and members of Crowther community. The Guest Preacher was **Rev. Canon Juwon Onasanya** of the Diocese of Egba and Chaplain of Chrisland University, Abeokuta. The service provided a moment of thanksgiving, reflection on God's faithfulness, and dedication of the staff, students, the semester, and the entire CGTS community to God for purposeful and impactful achievements. The service concluded at about **2:00 p.m.** with light refreshments.
